

### Read this first

#### About the recording format for recording motion pictures

You can select from AVCHD\* or iFrame recording formats to record motion pictures using this unit. (→ 71)

\* It is compatible with AVCHD 3D or AVCHD Progressive (1080/60p).

#### AVCHD 3D:

It is possible to record powerful, lifelike 3D full high-definition images.

A 3D compatible television compatible to the frame sequential format is required to view the 3D full high-definition images. (→ 163)

#### **AVCHD Progressive:**

It is possible to record 2D image in the highest quality (1080/60p) for this unit.

#### iFrame:

This is a recording format suitable for viewing or editing on Mac (iMovie'11).

 It is not compatible with motion pictures recorded in AVCHD format.

Panasonic does not accept any responsibility for damages directly or indirectly due to any type of problems that result in loss of recording or edited content, and does not guarantee any content if recording or editing does not work properly. Likewise, the above also applies in a case where any type of repair is made to the unit (including any other non-built-in memory related component).

#### Handling of built-in memory [HC-X920M]

This unit is equipped with the built-in memory. When using this component, pay attention to the following points.

#### Back up data periodically.

The built-in memory is temporary storage. In order to avoid erasing data due to static electricity, electromagnetic waves, breakage, and failures, back up the data to a PC or DVD disc. (→ 168)

- Access lamp [ACCESS] (→ 7) illuminates while the SD card or built-in memory is being accessed (initialization, recording, playback, deleting, etc.). Do not perform the following operations when the lamp illuminates. It may damage the built-in memory or cause a malfunction in the unit.
  - Turn the unit off (remove the battery)
  - Insert and remove the USB cable
  - Expose the unit to vibrations or shock
- About disposing of or giving away this unit.

### About Condensation (When the lens, the viewfinder or LCD Monitor is fogged up)

Condensation occurs when there is a change in temperature or humidity, such as when the unit is taken from outside or a cold room to a warm room. Please be careful, as it may cause the lens, the viewfinder or LCD monitor to become soiled, moldy, or damaged.

When taking the unit to a place which has a different temperature, if the unit is accustomed to the room temperature of the destination for about one hour, condensation can be prevented. (When the difference in temperature is severe, place the unit in a plastic bag or the like, remove air from the bag, and seal the bag.) When condensation has occurred, remove the battery and/or the AC adapter and leave the unit like that for about one hour. When the unit becomes accustomed to the surrounding temperature, fogginess will disappear naturally.

# Power supply

#### ■ About batteries that you can use with this unit

The battery that can be used with this unit is VW-VBN130/VW-VBN260.


• The unit has a function for distinguishing batteries which can be used safely. The dedicated battery (VW-VBN130/VW-VBN260) supports this function. The only batteries suitable for use with this unit are genuine Panasonic products and batteries manufactured by other companies and certified by Panasonic. (Batteries which do not support this function cannot be used). Panasonic cannot in any way guarantee the quality, performance or safety of batteries which have been manufactured by other companies and are not genuine Panasonic products.

It has been found that counterfeit battery packs which look very similar to the genuine product are made available to purchase in some markets. Some of these battery packs are not adequately protected with internal protection to meet the requirements of appropriate safety standards. There is a possibility that these battery packs may lead to fire or explosion. Please be advised that we are not liable for any accident or failure occurring as a result of use of a counterfeit battery pack. To ensure that safe products are used we would recommend that a genuine Panasonic battery pack is used.

### Inserting/removing the battery

Press the power button to turn off the unit. (→ 15)

Open the LCD monitor and install the battery by inserting it in the direction shown in the figure.




Insert the battery until it clicks and locks.

#### Removing the battery

Be sure to hold down the power button until the status indicator goes off. Then remove the battery while supporting the unit to prevent it from dropping.

Move the battery release lever in the direction indicated by the arrow and remove the battery when unlocked.




### Charging the battery

When this unit is purchased, the battery is not charged. Charge the battery fully before using this unit for the first time.

The unit is in the standby condition when the AC adaptor is connected. The primary circuit is always "live" as long as the AC adaptor is connected to an electrical outlet.

#### Important:

- Use the supplied AC adaptor. Do not use the AC adaptor of another device.
- Do not use the AC cable with any other equipment as it is designed only for this unit. Also, do not use the AC cable from other equipment with this unit.
- . The battery will not be charged if the unit is turned on.
- It is recommended to charge the battery in a temperature between 10 °C and 30 °C (50 °F and 86 °F). (The battery temperature should also be the same.)



#### A DC input terminal

• Insert the plugs as far as they will go.

#### Connect the AC cable to the AC adaptor, then the AC outlet.

### Connect the AC adaptor to the DC input terminal.

 The status indicator will flash red at an interval of 2 seconds (approximately 1 second on, 1 second off), indicating that charging has begun. It will turn off when the charging is completed.

#### ■ Connecting to the AC outlet

If you turn on the unit while connecting with the AC adaptor, you can use the unit with power supplied from the outlet.

When recording for a long time, keep the AC adaptor connected and use it together with the battery.

- If the status indicator flashes at a particularly fast or slow rate, refer to page 193.
- We recommend using Panasonic batteries (→ 12).
- If you use other batteries, we cannot guarantee the guality of this product.
- Do not heat or expose to flame.
- Do not leave the battery(ies) in a car exposed to direct sunlight for a long period of time with doors and windows closed.

- \* This will be the recording mode when the 3D Conversion Lens (optional) is attached.
- These times are approximations.
- The indicated charging time is for when the battery has been discharged completely.
   Charging time and recordable time vary depending on the usage conditions such as high/low temperature.
- The actual recordable time refers to the recordable time when repeatedly starting/stopping recording, turning the unit on/off, moving the zoom lever etc.
- The batteries heat up after use or charging. This is not a malfunction.

### Battery capacity indication

- Screen display will disappear when no touch operation is performed for a specific period of time. However, it will be constantly displayed when the remaining battery time becomes less than 30 minutes.
- The remaining battery capacity is displayed when using the Panasonic battery that you can
  use for this unit. The actual time can vary depending on your actual use.
- When using the AC adaptor or batteries made by other companies, the remaining battery capacity will not be shown.

# Recording to a card

The unit can record still pictures or motion pictures to an SD card or built-in memory. To record to an SD card, read the following.

### Cards that you can use with this unit

Use SD cards conforming to Class 4 or higher of the SD Speed Class Rating\* for motion picture recording.

- We do not guarantee the operation of SD cards other than the ones above. Further, SD cards with a capacity of less than 32 MB cannot be used for video recording.
- 4 GB or more Memory Cards that do not have the SDHC logo or 48 GB or more Memory Cards that do not have the SDXC logo are not based on SD Memory Card Specifications.
- When the write-protect switch on SD card is locked, no recording, deletion
  or editing will be possible on the card.
- Keep the Memory Card out of reach of children to prevent swallowing.




### Inserting/removing an SD card

When using an SD card not from Panasonic, or one previously used on other equipment, for the first time on this unit, format the SD card. (→ 41) When the SD card is formatted, all of the recorded data is deleted. Once the data is deleted, it cannot be restored.

#### Caution:

Check that the access lamp has gone off.



#### Access lamp [ACCESS] (A

- When this unit is accessing the SD card or built-in memory, the access lamp lights up.
- Open the SD card cover and insert (remove) the SD card into (from) the card slot.
- Face the label side (3) in the direction shown in the illustration and press it straight in as far as it will go.
- Press the center of the SD card and then pull it straight out.
- Press the part of the SD card cover and close the SD card cover.
- •
- Securely close it until it clicks.
- Do not touch the terminals on the back of the SD card.
- Do not apply strong shocks, bend, or drop the SD card.
- Electrical noise, static electricity or the failure of this unit or the SD card may damage or erase the data stored on the SD card.
- When the card access lamp is lit, do not:
  - Remove the SD card
  - Turn the unit off
  - Insert and remove the USB cable
  - Expose the unit to vibrations or shock
     Performing the above while the lamp is on may result in damage to data/SD card or this unit
- Do not expose the terminals of the SD card to water, dirt or dust.


- Do not place SD cards in the following areas:
  - In direct sunlight
  - In very dusty or humid areas
  - Near a heater
  - Locations susceptible to significant difference in temperature (condensation can occur.)
  - Where static electricity or electromagnetic waves occur
- To protect SD cards, return them to their cases when you are not using them.
- About disposing of or giving away the SD card. (→ 195)

# Turning the unit on/off

You can turn the unit on and off using the power button, the LCD monitor or the viewfinder.

#### Turning the unit on and off with the power button

Open the LCD monitor and press the power button to turn on the unit.



#### To turn off the unit

Hold down the power button until the status indicator goes off.

A The status indicator lights on.

### Turning the unit on and off with the LCD monitor/viewfinder

Opening the LCD monitor or extending the viewfinder turns on the unit. Closing the LCD monitor/ viewfinder turns off the unit.

During general use, you may find it convenient to turn the unit on/off using the LCD monitor or viewfinder.


- The unit will not turn off unless the LCD monitor is closed and the viewfinder is retracted.
- The unit will not turn off while recording motion pictures even if the LCD monitor is closed and the viewfinder is retracted.
- In the following cases, opening the LCD monitor or extending the viewfinder does not turn on the unit. Press the power button to turn on the unit.
  - When the unit is originally purchased
  - When you have turned off the unit using the power button
- When the [ECONOMY (BATT)] (

  36)/[ECONOMY (AC)] (

  36) is in operation, close the LCD monitor and viewfinder, and then open the LCD monitor or extend the viewfinder again.

# Selecting a mode

Operate the mode switch to change the mode to  $\stackrel{\blacksquare}{=}$ ,  $\bigcirc$  or  $\stackrel{\blacksquare}{=}$ .

# How to use the touch screen

You can operate by directly touching the LCD monitor (touch screen) with your finger.

#### ■ Touch


Touch and release the touch screen to select icon or picture.

- Touch the center of the icon.
- Touching the touch screen will not operate while you are touching another part of the touch screen.



#### ■ Slide while touching

Move your finger while pressing on the touch screen.



#### About the operation icons

Touch when changing a page or performing settings.


Touch to return to the previous screen.



#### **About the Touch Menu**

Touch  $\triangleleft$  (left side)/ $\triangleright$  (right side) of  $\blacksquare$  on the Touch Menu to switch the operation icons.

 It is also possible to switch the operation icons by sliding the Touch Menu right or left while touching it.



- ⑤ Operation icons to display can be changed. (→ 38)
- Displayed only in Intelligent Auto Plus Mode (→ 49) and [Miniature Effect]/[8mm movie]/ [Silent movie] of the Creative Control Mode (→ 49).
- Displayed only in [Time Lapse Rec] of the Creative Control Mode (→ 49), Scene Mode (→ 53) and the Manual Mode (→ 55).
- Displayed only when connected to a TV. (→ 163)
- To display the Touch Menu



Display of the Touch Menu will disappear when no touch operation is performed for a specific period of time during recording of motion picture/still picture. To display it again, touch

• Do not touch on the LCD monitor with hard pointed tips, such as ball point pens.





# Setting date and time

The clock is not set at the time of purchase. Make sure to set the clock.

Select the menu. (→ 32)

MENU: [SETUP] → [CLOCK SET]

Touch the date or time to be set, then set the desired value using  $\square / \square$ .

Displaying the World Time setting (→ 34):

♠ [HOME]/ [DESTINATION]

The year can be set between 2000 and 2039.

Touch [ENTER].

 A message prompting for World Time setting may be displayed. Perform the World Time setting by touching the screen. (→ 34)

- Touch [EXIT] to complete the setting.
- HC-X920 / HC-X920M

At the time of purchase, the confirmation screen for the Wi-Fi setup is displayed after setting the world time. (→ 134)

Exit the screen if the setup is not necessary.

- When the unit is turned on for the first time, a message asking you to set the date and time will appear. Select [YES] and perform Steps 2 to 3 to set the date and time.
- The date and time function is driven by a built-in lithium battery.
- If the time display becomes [- -], the built-in lithium battery needs to be charged. To recharge the built-in lithium battery, connect the AC adaptor or attach the battery to this unit. The battery is still being recharged even if the unit is off. Leave the unit as it is for approx. 24 hours and the battery will maintain the date and time for approx. 6 months.



# Before recording

#### Basic camera positioning



- Hold the unit with both hands.
- 2 Put your hand through the grip belt.
- It is convenient to use the recording button icon when holding the unit at waist level.
- When recording, make sure your footing is stable and there is no danger of colliding with another person or object.
- When you are outdoors, record pictures with the sunlight behind you. If the subject is backlit, it will become dark in the recording.
- Keep your arms near your body and separate your legs for better balance.
- Do not cover the microphones or the cooling fan inlet with your hand etc.


#### Basic motion picture recording

- The unit should normally be held steady when recording.
- If you move the unit when recording, do so slowly, maintaining a constant speed.
- The zoom operation is useful for recording subjects you cannot get close to, but overuse of zoom
  in and zoom out can make the resulting motion picture less enjoyable to watch.

# ■ To adjust the image in the viewfinder

# Adjust to make the image clear by rotating the eyepiece corrector dial.

 Extend the viewfinder and close the LCD monitor to turn on the viewfinder.



#### ■ Recording yourself

#### Rotate the LCD monitor towards the lens side.

- The image is horizontally flipped as if you see a mirror image.
   (However, the image recorded is the same as a normal recording.)



#### ■ Attaching/Removing the lens hood

This will reduce the extra light entering the lens in bright sunlight or backlight etc., making it possible to take clearer pictures.

# Selecting a media to record [HC-X920M]

The card and built-in memory can be selected separately to record motion pictures or still pictures.



- 3 Press the recording start/stop button to start recording.

- Recording can also be started/stopped by touching the recording button icon.




# **Recording still pictures**

- 1 Change the mode to 🔘 .
- 2 Open the LCD monitor or extend the viewfinder.
- 3 Press the button halfway. (For Auto Focus only)

- If you set the Optical Image Stabilizer function (→ 46) to (MDE1), then the Image Stabilizer function will be more effective. (MEGA (MEGA Optical Image Stabilizer) will be displayed when the button is pressed halfway.)
- The AF assist lamp lights in dark places.
- Using a flash or tripod is recommended when recording still pictures in dark places because the shutter speed becomes slow.
- You can also take a picture just by touching the subject to focus. (Touch Shutter: → 62)
- The still picture recording time may be long depending on the picture size.
- The focus indication and the focus area may not be displayed depending on the recording conditions or the menu settings.

- It will be constantly displayed when the remaining number of still pictures that can be recorded becomes 200 or less.

#### About the focusing area

When there is a contrasting object ahead or behind the subject in the focus area, the subject may not be focused. If so, move the contrasting object out of the focus area.

### Recording still pictures in Motion Picture Recording Mode



Press the button fully (press to the bottom) to take the picture.

- It is possible to record still pictures while recording motion pictures. (Simultaneous recording)
- While still pictures are being recorded, turns red and the remaining number of recordable pictures is displayed.

- No shutter sound is emitted when recording still pictures.
- Built-in flash, Red-eve Reduction, Self-timer (→ 68) do not work.
- While recording motion pictures or during the PRE-REC operation, image quality is different from ordinary still pictures so that motion picture recording takes preference over still picture recording.
- If simultaneous recording is used while recording a motion picture, the recordable time remaining
  will shorten. If the unit is turned off or the mode switch operated, the recordable time remaining
  may lengthen.
- The still picture recording time may be long depending on the picture size.
- Maximum number of recordable pictures that can be displayed is 9999. If the number of recordable pictures exceeds 9999, R 9999+ is displayed. The number will not change when the picture is taken until the number of recordable pictures is 9999 or less.
- The recording time may be long depending on the recording condition.

## About the zoom speed

- Extra Optical Zoom ratio varies depending on the setting of [PICTURE SIZE] and [ASPECT RATIO]. (→ 84, 85)
- If you take your finger off the zoom lever during zoom operation, the operation sound may be recorded. When returning the zoom lever to the original position, move it quietly.
- When the zoom magnification is at its maximum, the subjects are focused at about 1.2 m (3.9 feet) or more.







Motion pictures or still pictures recorded with this unit can be copied between an SD card inserted in this unit and a built-in memory.

#### Check the used space of the copy destination

It is possible to check the used space of the SD card or built-in memory by [MEDIA STATUS]  $(\rightarrow 42)$ .

- By displaying in 1 scene or touching and holding the thumbnail in the 20 scenes or 9 scenes display, recording date and time are displayed when playing back motion pictures, and recording date and file number when playing back still pictures.
- Depending on the media condition, some remaining capacity of the SD card or built-in memory may not be used.
- If the remaining capacity on a single SD card is not enough, you can copy to multiple SD cards following the instruction on the screen. In this case, the last scene copied to an SD card is automatically divided to fit the space on the SD card.
- If you divide the scenes (> 104), and copy by scene selection, it is possible to copy matching the remaining capacity of the media, or only the necessary parts.

- If there is little or no remaining capacity in the SD card, a confirmation message asking to copy after deleting all data on the SD card is displayed. Be aware that deleted data cannot be restored.

To copy approx. 600 MB still pictures (Picture size 20.4m):

Approx. 3 minutes to 5 minutes

If you will delete the motion pictures or still pictures after copying is complete, be sure to play back the motion pictures or still pictures to check that they have been copied to correctly before deleting.

- Depending on the following conditions, the time it takes for copying may be longer.
  - The number of recorded scenes is large.
  - The temperature of the unit is high.
- If some motion pictures or still pictures have already been recorded to the copy destination, then
  the same date may be assigned or images may not display by date when the list by date is
  selected.
- When converting and copying the scenes recorded in AVCHD to an MP4 scene, the scene exceeding approximately 20 minutes is automatically divided.
- Motion pictures that have been recorded on another device may not be copied. Data recorded on a PC with HD Writer AE 5.0, etc. cannot be copied.
- Protection settings will be cleared on the copied motion pictures and still pictures when copying
  motion pictures and still pictures with protection settings.
- The order in which the scenes or still pictures were copied cannot be changed.

# Copying/playing back with a USB HDD



In this Operating Instructions, "USB hard disk drive" is indicated as "USB HDD".

If you connect a USB HDD (commercially-available) to this unit by using a USB Connection Cable (supplied with USB HDD), you can copy motion pictures and still pictures recorded on this unit to a USB HDD.

- When moving the unit as you record, move it slowly.
- Try to hold the unit as steady as possible when recording while riding in a vehicle or walking.
- Use of a tripod is recommended for recording with a stable picture.
- You cannot record 3D images while using the Wi-Fi function even if you attach the 3D Conversion Lens.
- [ECONOMY (BATT)]/[ECONOMY (AC)] will not work while you adjust the 3D Conversion Lens attachment position.
- When the 3D Conversion Lens is attached, the auto slow shutter setting is [AUTO SLOW SHTR (3D)]. (→ 78)
- While 3D recording if moving the unit fast, the message is more likely to appear.
- The LCD monitor on this unit will not display in 3D.






