Copying phonebook entries from a Bluetooth cellular phone (phonebook transfer)

You can copy phonebook entries from the registered cellular phones or other cellular phones (not registered) to the unit's shared phonebook.

Copying phonebook entries from a Bluetooth cellular phone

 - Copied items are stored to the group ("Cell 1" or "Cell 2") which the cellular phone is registered to.

[\uparrow]: "Other cell" \rightarrow [SELECT] \rightarrow [\uparrow]: Select the group you want to copy to. \rightarrow [SELECT]

 - [↓]: Select "Auto" Or "Manual". → [SELECT]

"Auto": Download all entries from the cellular phone automatically. Go to step 5. "Manual": Copy entries you selected.

• "Select mode" menu is displayed only when the cellular phone supports PBAP (Phone Book Access Profile) for Bluetooth connection.



Using a Bluetooth wireless headset (optional) for landline calls

By registering a Bluetooth headset to the base unit, you can have a hands-free conversation wirelessly for landline calls.

• While someone is using a cellular line, the Bluetooth headset connection is not available.


