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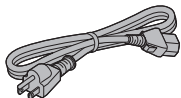

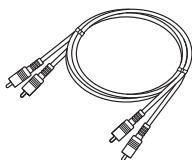

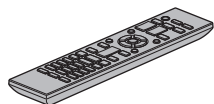

Installation

Turn off all the equipment before connection and read the appropriate operating instructions. Be sure to raise this unit when moving, and do not drag this unit.

Unit care

Pull out the AC power supply cord from the socket before maintenance. Clean this unit with a soft cloth.

- When dirt is heavy, wring a wet cloth tightly to wipe the dirt, and then wipe it with a soft cloth.

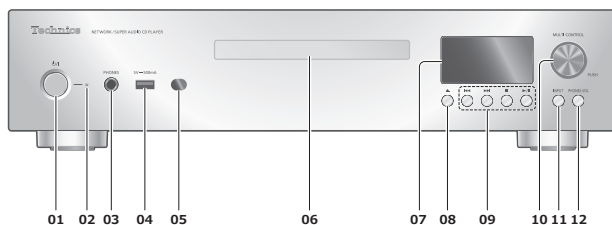

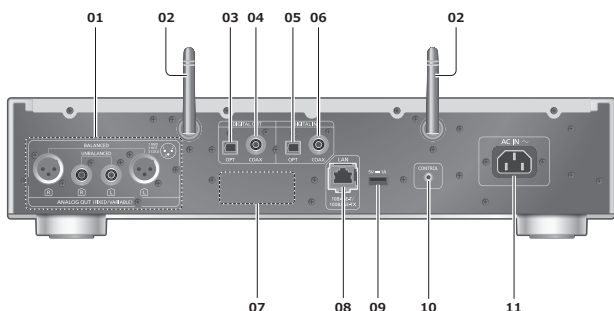

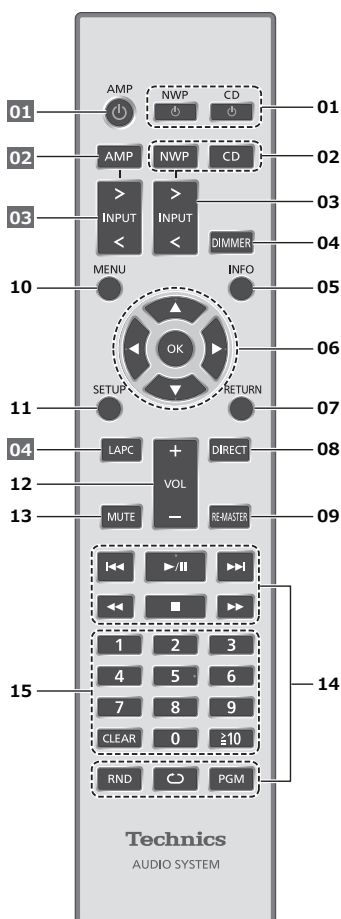

01 [NWP - Press to switch the unit from on to standby mode or vice versa. In standby mode, the unit is still consuming a small amount of power. The input source also switches for each selector (switches to the last selected input source when [NWP 02 [NWP]/[CD]: Select the device to be operated

- The playing layer switches by pressing [CD] while the playback stops for Hybrid Super Audio CD (SACD).
- Press and hold [CD] to switch to “Pure Disc Playback” mode. (⇒ 44)

03 [>INPUT<]: Switch the input source

04 [DIMMER]: Adjust the brightness of the power indicator, display, etc.*2

- When the display is turned off, it will light up for a few seconds only when you operate this unit. Before the display turns off, "Display Off" will be displayed for a few seconds.

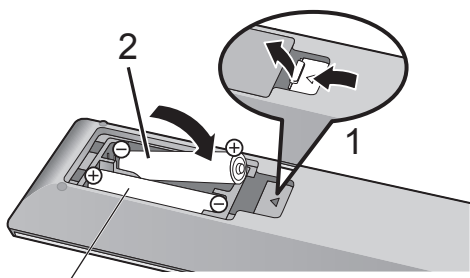

Remote control mode

When other equipment responds to the supplied remote control, change the remote control mode.

- The factory default is "Mode 1".

1 Press [NWP].

3 Press [\blacktriangle], [\blacktriangledown] to select "Remote Control" and then press [OK].

- The current remote control mode of this unit is displayed.

4 When "Set Mode 1/2" is displayed, change the remote control mode of the remote control.

To set "Mode 1":

Press and hold [OK] and [1] for at least 4 seconds.

To set "Mode 2":

Press and hold [OK] and [2] for at least 4 seconds.

5 Point the remote control at this unit, and press and hold [OK] for at least 4 seconds.

- When the remote control mode is changed, the new mode will appear on the display for a few seconds.

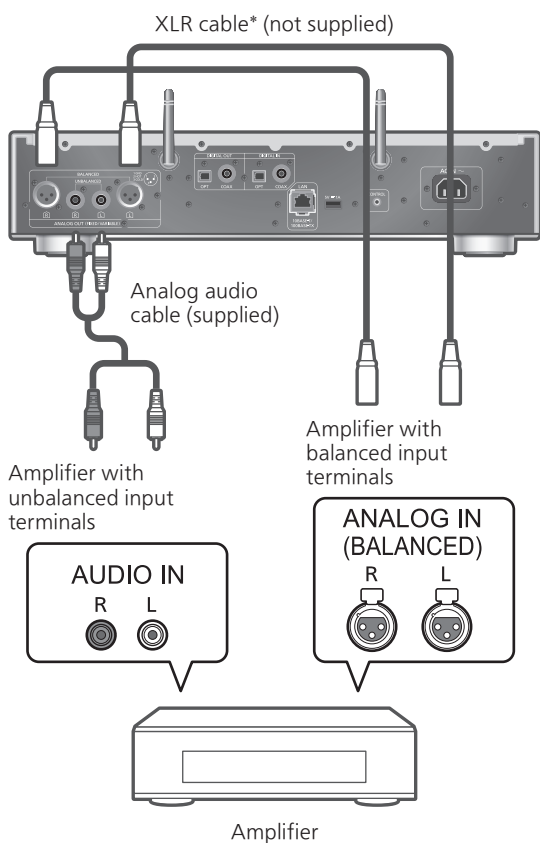

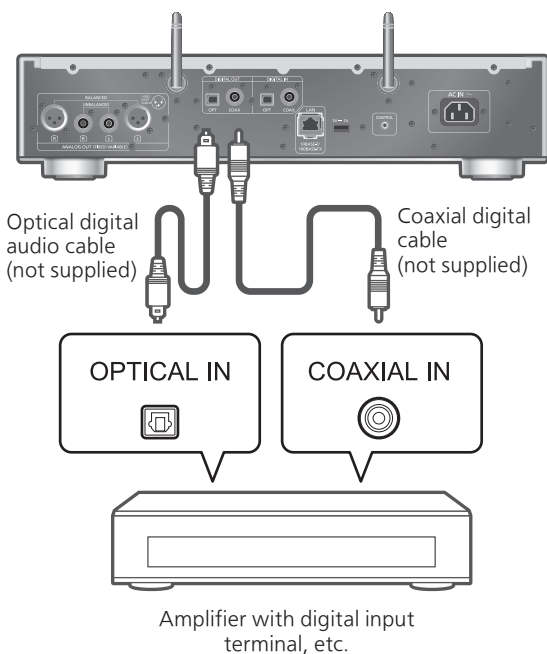

- Do not use any other analog audio cables except the supplied one.
- When you connect a power amplifier, etc., set "A.Output Level" to "Variable" for volume control with this unit. When you connect a pre-amplifier, etc., set "A.Output Level" to "Fixed" for volume control with the connected device. (⇒ 79)
 - The factory default is "Fixed".

Connecting to an amplifier with digital input terminal

You can output digital audio signals from this unit by connecting to an amplifier with digital input terminal, etc. and play back music.

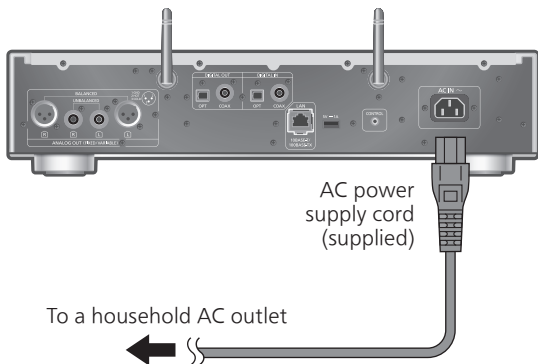

- Audio signal of Super Audio CD and Super Audio CD layer of Hybrid Super Audio CD cannot be output from the digital audio output terminal of this unit. Connect the device to the analog audio output terminal.

Connect only after all other connections are completed.



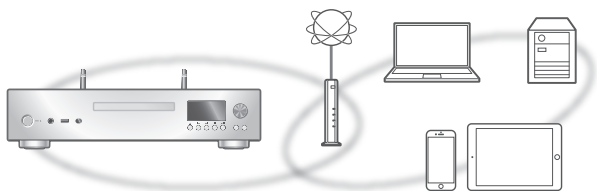
- Use only the supplied AC power supply cord.
- Insert the plugs of the cables to be connected all the way in.
- Do not bend cables at sharp angles.
- “Wi-Fi” function switching screen is displayed following “Wi-Fi Setup” when this unit is turned on. If you stop the Wi-Fi setting, set to “Off” and press [OK]. To keep the Wi-Fi setting, start the “Google Home” app and follow the on-screen instructions. (⇒ 28, 30)

Network settings

You can stream online music services or music files from your smartphone/tablet to this unit. To use these features, this system must join the same internet-connected network as the compatible device.



This unit can be connected to a router using a LAN cable or built-in Wi-Fi®.

For a stable connection to the network, a wired LAN connection is recommended.

■ Preparation

If you install the “Google Home” app on your smartphone/tablet, you can set up a connection using the application.

- When using the Chromecast-enabled apps to play music on this unit, set up a connection using the “Google Home” app.
- Make sure that the Wi-Fi function and Bluetooth® feature are activated on your smartphone/tablet.

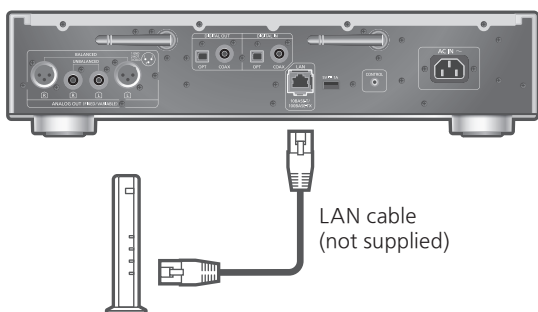

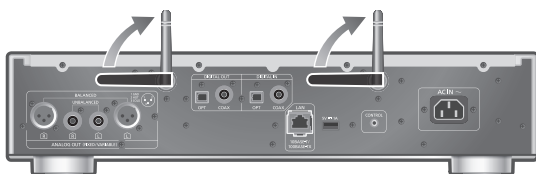

- Inserting any cable other than a LAN cable in the LAN port can damage the unit.
- After turning on this unit, it may take some time until this unit is activated.
- After the network connection is set up, “Updating” may be displayed and the firmware for this unit may be updated.

- To cancel this setting in the middle, press [] or turn the unit to standby mode.
- When this unit is switched to standby mode and turned on before the Wi-Fi setting is complete, “Wi-Fi Setup” is displayed. Perform the Wi-Fi setting or select “Off”.
- For other connection methods (⇒ 31)

Setting the network from the setup menu (When not using the Chromecast-enabled apps with this unit)

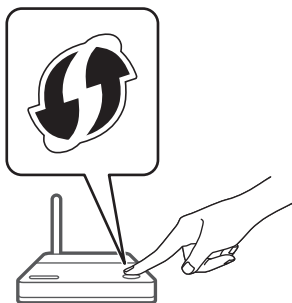

To deliver the master quality audio of MQA, MQA decoding function needs to be set to "On". Switch the MQA decoding function to "On" or "Off" in the following steps.

- "MQA Decoding : On" is displayed and the MQA decoding function is set to "On". (Press and hold for approx. 2 seconds again to set the function to "Off".)

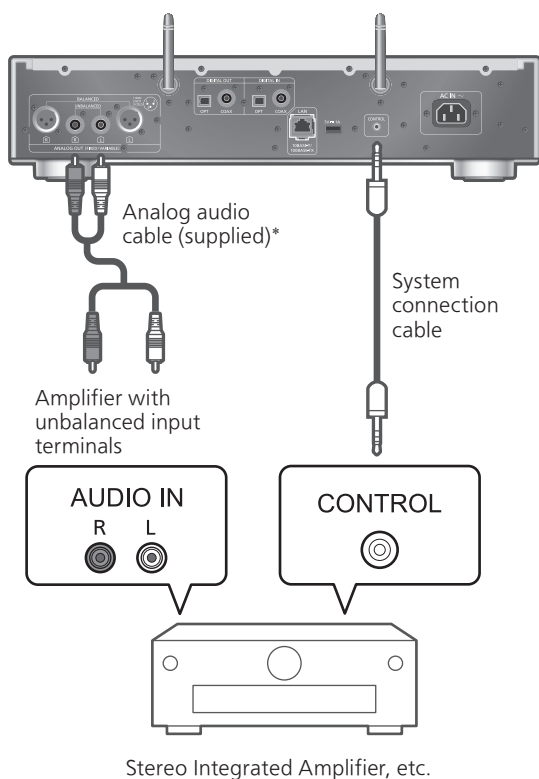

Heat buildup of this unit

This unit becomes warm while in use.

- Be careful when touching the bottom of this unit because the bottom of this unit may be hot. For installation or unit care, disconnect the AC power supply cord, wait for at least 3 minutes.

Do you have the latest firmware installed?

Panasonic is constantly improving the unit's firmware to ensure that our customers are enjoying the latest technology. (⇒ 83)

To restore all the settings to the factory defaults

When the following situations occur, reset the memory:

- There is no response when buttons are pressed.
- You want to clear and reset the memory contents.

- 1 Press [NWP] while this unit is turned on.**
- 2 Press [SETUP].**
- 3 Press [▲], [▼] repeatedly to select “Initialization” and then press [OK].**
- 4 Press [▲], [▼] to select “Yes” and then press [OK].**
 - A confirmation screen appears. Select “Yes” in the following steps to restore all the settings to defaults.
- 5 Press [▲], [▼] to select “Yes” and then press [OK] again.**

General

The unit does not work.

Operations are not done properly.

Disc

Incorrect display or play does not start.

- Make sure that the disc is compatible with this unit. (⇒ 104)
- There is moisture on the lens. Wait for about an hour and then try again.
- Unfinalized CD-R and CD-RW cannot be played back.
- WMA/MP3 is not supported. Refer to “Notes on discs” (⇒ 104) for information about the discs this unit can play back.

Playback takes time to start.

- It may take some time for the disc to load if there are a lot of tracks on it.

USB

The USB drive or its contents cannot be read.

- The USB drive format or its contents is/are not compatible with the unit. (⇒ 105)

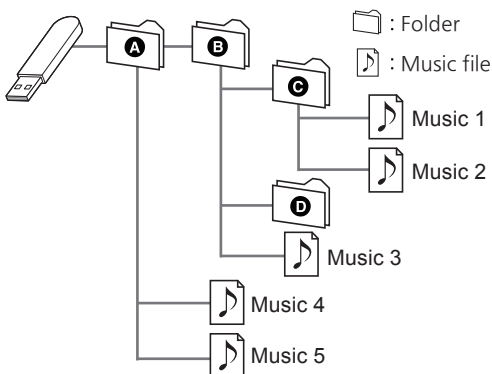
